1. Complete novice soft dirt road trail, no low range required. Suitable for all Land Rovers including the Freelander.
2. Limited low range required but suitable for the novice driver. Suitable for all Land Rovers including the Freelander.
3. Low range and limited off road knowledge required. Suitable for all Land Rovers with certain trails not suitable for the Freelander.
4. A low range technical trail suitable for the experienced. The inexperienced will be able to do the trail, as assistance will be available from the more experienced members. Suitable for all Land Rovers except the Freelander.
5. Extremely technical, suitable for the experienced only with the possibility of vehicle damage. Suitable for "Series" and modified Land Rovers.

PLEASE NOTE : Recovery points are mandatory on all vehicles on a grade 4 and 5 trail.

Note: For All Gates Events:

1. Only paid up LROC members will be able to compete in the Gates Events from now on.
2. Non LROC members welcome to attend as spectators.
3. Only LAND ROVER vehicles will be allowed to take part. No other make of vehicle.

- We will set separate obstacles for standard and modified vehicles.

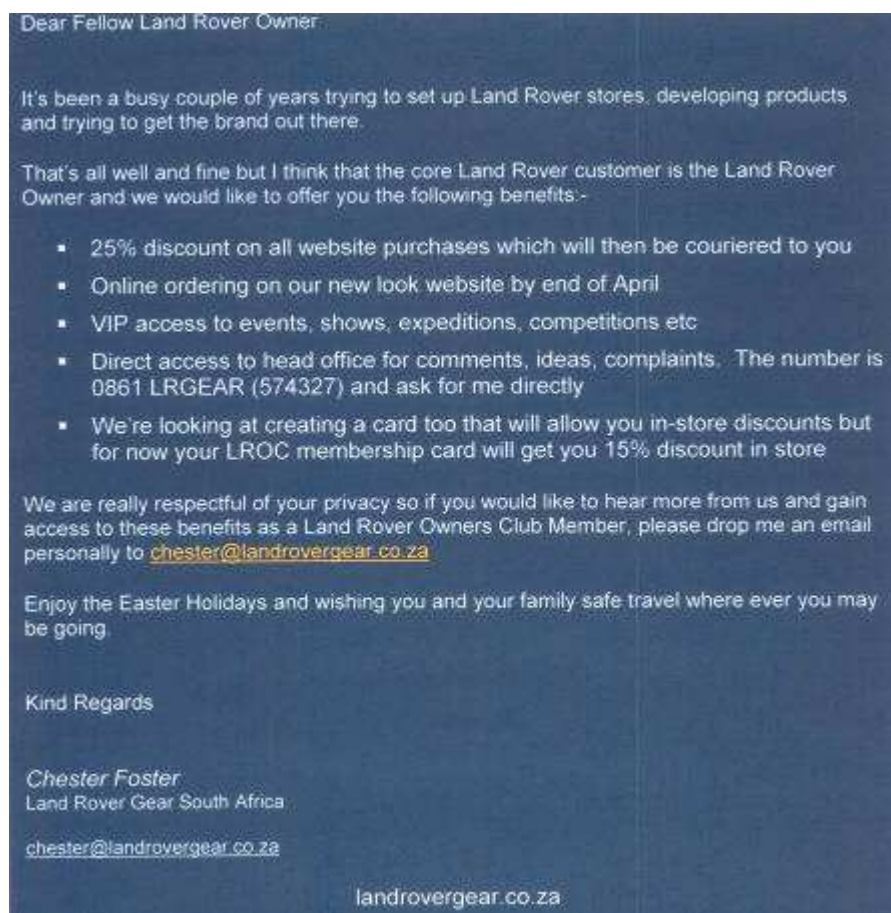
Spectators welcome, it's also a social day with a braai.

For me the highlight of the weekend was the late-night drive Saturday night as well as the river drive the next day. Message from Glen Twigg



We all recall Glen's accident after the Inanda trip – he was coming around a corner when he felt his steering become a little loose. He pulled off the road onto what he thought was a grassy patch but was actually a culvert covered with vegetation.

He has sent me the following message:

"A BIG Thanks to all the guys who helped me after my accident, thanks for winching me out and removing my tyres and not to forget towing the flat-bed out the valley. I am thankful that I came out of the accident with only whiplash and a very sad Landy, a big reason for this is that I was wearing a seat belt, which I added while building the Landy, R 500.00 saved me from going through the front window as the Landy stopped dead at approx. 40 km/h. 40 km/h doesn't seem fast until you think about driving a 1,5 ton vehicle into a solid concrete wall, the chassis front horns have dropped about 200mm and the entire front suspension and axle was torn from its mountings.

Seat belts are extremely important and all I ask of you guys is to check your vehicles well after playing and BUCKLE-UP once on the road for you and your passenger's safety.
